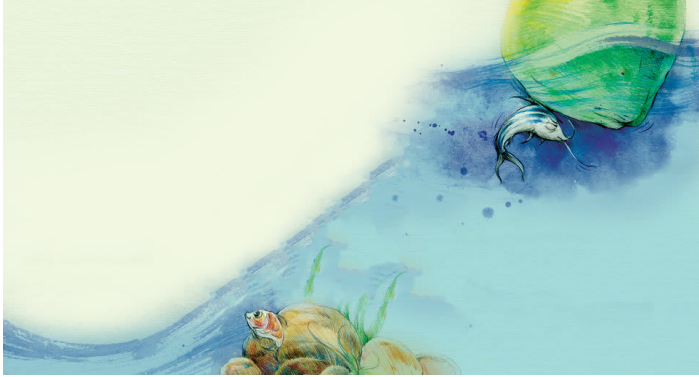

Tengra and Puti are playing in the river. All of a sudden, Tengra bumps his head on something hard.



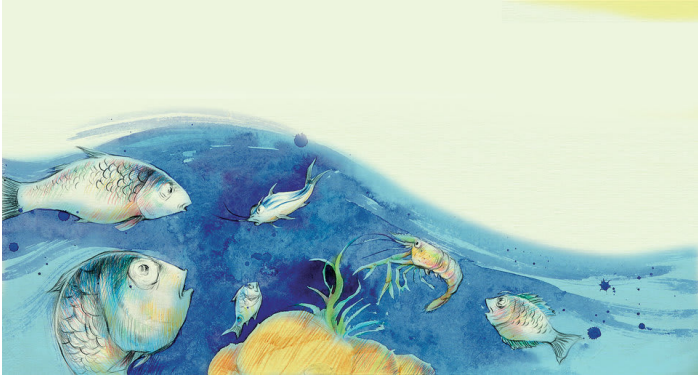
"Ouch! What is that?" Tengra says angrily.
